Exercise

The war concluded yesterday for the 507th TFG. The last day was characterized by conventional air attacks in the morning followed by nuclear strikes in the afternoon.

The first nuclear detonation (apparently aimed at a ship) occurred in the Aegean Sea, just south of the Dardanelles (the southern portion of the Turkish Straits). The winds were such that fallout posed no threat to Cigli AB.

The next nuclear strike hit Bandirma AB in the north of Turkey on the coast of the Black Sea.

The third strike hit Baliesehir AB, 80 nautical miles northeast of Cigli. The winds caused the 507th to implement its "horizontal dispersal" plan. This plan sends the aircraft, maintenance and munition crews to Eskesehir AB and Sivrihesar AB in central Turkey. This took the 507th TFG people and equipment out of the fallout pattern.

Before the dispersal plan was implemented, the exercise and the ORI went Condition White.
