

Air Refueling Wing Reserve Citizen Airmen flew 10 aerial refueling missions in a KC-135R Stratotanker Jan. 10-24, in support of Exercise Sentry Aloha, hosted by the Hawaii Air National Guard's 154th Wing located at Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, Hawaii.

Sentry Aloha is an ongoing series of combat exercises conducted by the HIANG several times a year. This iteration



involved more than 900 personnel and nearly 40 aircraft from five other states. The 154th Wing is the largest Air National Guard wing in the U.S.

Other visiting units included E-3 Sentry support from the 513th Air Control Group, Tinker AFB, Oklahoma, F-16 Falcons from the 354th Fighter Wing, Eielson AFB, Alaska, and F-15 Eagles from the 144th FW, Fresno Air National Guard Base, California.

According to 507th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron avionics technician, Staff Sgt. Zachary Ludwig, the 507th ARW KC-135R Stratotanker has refueled most of these aircraft types during Sentry Aloha, but success didn't come without a few challenges.

"We've had a couple of minor maintenance issues," Ludwig said. "But as a team, we come from a wide variety of backgrounds and experiences, so we were able to fix the problems with minimal impact to the mission."

507th ARW Reserve Citizen Airmen also performed aerial refueling with F-22 Raptors from the 199th Fighter Squadron, part of the 154th Wing, and the 19th Fighter Squadron, 15th Wing, JBPHH, Hawaii.

According to 465th Air Refueling Squadron KC-135R pilot, 1st Lt. Brenden Valenti, from Tinker AFB, Oklahoma, participating in the exercise provided real-world training for all Airmen.

"Anytime we go support an exercise or another unit outside of Oklahoma, the flight protocols are slightly different," he said. "The last thing we want is for certain skill sets to atrophy, so being here has given invaluable experience to keep everyone capable and ready."

Valenti also said that Sentry Aloha allowed different organizations the opportunity to interact.

"We had active duty, Guard and Reserve all working together to support the mission," Valenti said. "And for new Airmen like me, it gives us a chance to see how the lines disappear in order to get the job done. We're all Airmen and it's one team, one fight."



## **CIVILIAN RESERVE** CITIZEN AIRMEN **FURLOUGHED**

During a lapse of appropriations, some civilians in the 507th Air Refueling Wing at Tinker Air Force Base, Okla., received furlough paperwork Jan 22, 2018.

ivilian Reserve Citizen Airmen in the 507th Air Refueling Wing at Tinker Air Force Base were furloughed Jan. 22 following a government shutdown Jan. 20 due to a lapse in appropriations.

The furlough ended on the evening of Jan. 22,

when President Trump signed a short-term continuing resolution. The CR temporarily funds the government through Feb. 8. The bill stated "employees fur-

and help each other through these uncertain times."

loughed as a result of any lapse in appropriations which begins on or about January 20, 2018, shall be compensated at their standard rate of compensation, for the period of such lapse in appropriations, as soon as practicable after such lapse in appropriations ends."

A minimum number of employees needed to accomplish mission activities necessary to national security were excepted from the furlough. Excepted members received notification through their respective chains of command.

Most Air Reserve Technicians were excepted from the furlough to support our national security, meaning most ARTs reported to work and supported the mission as usual. ARTs were notified by their supervisors if they were furloughed.

"We understand that a furlough is distressing to our civilian teammates," Col. Douglas Gullion, 507th ARW commander said. "Please continue to be good wingmen and help each other through these uncertain times."

According to AFRC, a lack of a budget or continuing resolution will force another furlough,

creating serious uncer-Please continue to be good wingmen tainty and disruptive financial effects on an already stressed workforce of thousands of civilian Reserve Citizen Airmen.

> In the event of another shutdown, group leadership will issue letters to employees subject to the furlough with instructions on what to expect and procedures for returning to work once the shutdown ends. If you are furloughed, stay up to date with the news. Your leadership will contact you regarding when to return to work. Updates will be posted on Facebook and Twitter.

I love the troubleshooting and problem solving, because if one way doesn't work then we can always find another way.



# TRANSITION **ASSISTANCE** PROGRAM **CHANGES**

ecent policy changes are making it easier for Air Force Reservists to meet mandatory Transition Assistance Program requirements.

"All Reservists on orders for 180 consecutive days or more are congressionally mandated to complete transition requirements before their orders end," said Mandie Holovach, Air Force Reserve Command's Transition Assistance Program manager.

The mandatory transition requirements are to attend a pre-separation briefing, a transition Goals, Plans, Success (GPS) workshop, a Veterans Affairs benefits briefing and a capstone event.

"There were a lot of people who spoke up about the mandatory TAP requirements and their voices have been heard," Holovach said. "Within the past year, there have been some policy changes that make it easier for Reservists to complete their mandatory requirements."

There are new exemptions in place for the preseparation briefing and the VA benefits briefing.

If a member has completed a pre-separation briefing within the last five years, he or she does not have to complete another pre-separation briefing.

"Before this exemption was announced, the preseparation briefing was only good for one year, which meant each time the member came off orders, he or she would have to accomplish another briefing," Holovach said.

A second exemption stipulates that if a member has completed a VA benefits briefing within the last three years, he or she does not need to re-accomplish another VA benefits briefing.

The three-day Department of Labor workshop that is held during the five-day transition GPS workshop is a mandatory requirement for all Reservists.

However, if a member has a full-time job, is registered in a full-time higher education program

or has been to the Department of Labor workshop previously, the member is exempt from attending another Labor Department workshop.

In addition to these exemptions, TAP officials have made completing the mandatory requirements easier by providing members a virtual option for completing the transition GPS workshop and VA benefits briefing.

"Members are welcome to attend at their local Airman and Family Readiness office in person or virtually through the Joint Knowledge Online website," Holovach said.

Reservists can also complete the pre-separation briefing in person or virtually through YouTube video.

The Transition Assistance Program helps service members and their families successfully navigate through the transition process by providing them with information about the transition services. benefits and resources available to them.

The workshop program also provides members with job search skills, tips on resume writing, networking, interviewing and labor market research. There are even optional two-day tracks available for service members and their dependents, including an entrepreneur training track, a higher education track and a career technical training track.

TAP is not just a program focused on employment. It is an asset to connect members and their families to critical benefits and entitlements. And with the current exemptions, it can be completed within one day.
