Being in my position, I have witnessed some absolutely wonderful scenes of Airmanship and unity. Unfortunately, I've also witnessed some awful scenes of when leadership, supervisors and Airmen had little to no concern for their jobs or others. I often ask myself why this is.

I remember being deployed and meeting Retired U.S. Army Gen. Colin Powell, the former secretary of state. Powell said, "Leadership is solving problems. If they are already strong, we can work to make them even better. No leader wants to be defined as a toxic leader, but some get caught up in the drive towards mission objectives and they forget about the people.

Like all Airmen, I have dealt with my share of obstacles, both personally and professionally. So I understand many are scared that I'm going to ruin their jobs or careers, but that is not my goal. I am here to provide assistance to members of our wing, in hopes of solving problems before they become unmanageable.

In the past year, I have helped more than 67 Airmen find resources and programs that enabled them to take care of their families so they can focus on their daily jobs. I talk to Airmen, spouses and families to try to help them with stress, anxiety and other issues; whether it's through a referral to a counselor or a budgeting class. I am in the community more than you know.

It is an honor to be able to see everyone working together, whether they're in uniform or a civilian. I appreciate the members of our wing for their sacrifice and commitment to excellence, integrity and service. If you need assistance, contact me anytime at 734-6347.

Are you protecting your Personally Identifiable Information (PII)?

The end of the year is an excellent time to remind all personnel of the importance of protecting Personally Identifiable Information (PII). It is incumbent upon all Air Force personnel to be aware of the following policies:

- Protecting information is everyone's business!
- Protect all electronic data, reports and rosters that contain PII by encrypting or protecting the information with a password. Lock paper data, reports and rosters in a secure place.
- Only individuals with a need-to-know to accomplish their official duties may have access to documents containing PII.
- All government information must be properly secured and properly destroyed. Always shred PA/PII documents or take them to an office that has a large capacity shredder.
- When transmitting personal information over e-mail, encrypt the email by clicking on the "Contains PII" button in the toolbar. This will ensure the email is signed, encrypted and labeled in accordance with Air Force and DoD Directives.

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FEDERAL EMPLOYEES INSURANCE 'OPEN SEASON' RUNS NOV. 12- DEC. 10



of open season for the 2019 Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) Program, Federal Flexible Spending Accounts Program (FSAFEDS), and the Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP). Open season ends on Dec. 10.

During the open season, employees may enroll, change health plans or options, cancel enrollment, change to Self Only, Self+I or Self and Family and waive or begin participation in premium conversion. Open season enrollment or changes will be effective Jan. 6, 2019 for AF employees.

Additionally, due to the changes at the Air Force Personnel Center (AFPC), the link for making FEHB changes is now called Government Retirement and Benefits (GRB) Platform instead of EBIS. GRB is accessed through MyPers.

he July 12, 2019, deadline for transferring Post 9/11 benefits for those members with 16 years of time-in-service has been deferred for a year, according to a memo dated Oct. 25, 2018.


On July 12, 2018, the Department of Defense issued Change I to Department of Defense Instruction (DoDI) 1341.13, "Post-9/11 GI Bill," updating policy on the transfer of Post-9/11 GI Bill educational benefits by Service members to eligible family members. Change I is consistent with the purpose of authorizing such transfers as an incentive for recruiting and retention

following requisite periods of service by the Service member and an agreement for future service, as applicable.

Recognizing that some of these changes were effective immediately, certain Service members previously eligible to transfer benefits, but who had not yet successfully completed the transfer process, may have found themselves no longer eligible to transfer their educational benefits.

Accordingly, and to ensure that the unique situations of these members are fairly and expediently addressed, the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness is deferring implementation of the deletion of Enclosure 3, paragraph 3.a.(2) of DoDI 1341.13, "Post-9/1.1 GI Bill" for a period of 1 year from the effective date of Change 1.
