# 513th Air Control Group leads testing of next-gen collaboration tech

ing it digitally to the entire crew.

"We'd see things like Iron Man or Minority Report, and we'd ask ourselves why we can't have that at our jobs, on the jet or at the [air operations center]," he recalled. "So we built it. A Minority Report-like interface for the DOD. The genesis came out of warfighter requirements for multi-domain command and control, and the inspiration came out of Hollywood."

today's Air Force operations, chat is king. Using technology developed in the late 80s, AWACS aircrew members pass text line-by-line to other command and control agencies to make requests, update on developing situations or deliver results from completed missions.

In late June, the 513th and Hadron Industries, the industry partner behind ACES, completed its third milestone out of eight in an AFWERX-funded military use assessment that will test how ACES technology will improve data sharing between command and control agencies.

"It doesn't have to be that way," Col. James Mattey said. Mattey is the commander of the 513th Air Control Group and has been working with a veteran-owned small business to develop a platform called Advanced Collaboration for Enterprise Services, or ACES.

The third milestone was to build out six workstations that will simulate a partial crew on the AWACS. Hadron engineers integrated software that is used on board the aircraft and expanded the capabilities of air battle managers by providing more pixel space and the ability to share data and applications.

Mattey's vision was born out of frustration from using different applications and systems that weren't compatible with each other, forcing him to walk across an operations floor to point out an air track of interest on another officer's screen instead of highlight-

"We have a lot of great capabilities that are stovepiped, that are proprietary, and ACES allows us to bring them all together in a visual arena with almost zero integration cost," Mattey said. "We can take apps or images, and move them to any device, any screen."

The development of ACES and the build out of a dedicated environment to enable testing was funded through Small Business Innovation Research funds, which is a Congressional initiative overseen by the Small Business Administration. The program encourages domestic small businesses to engage in Federal research and development.

"The SBIR program has been instrumental in allowing us warfighters to go after CSAF Brown's directive to accelerate change or lose," Mattey said. "This prototype here was fragged to be an 18-month project, and we're going to do it in seven."

Interest in ACES has grown across the DOD, with Air Combat Command's Futures
Division calling it a foundational technology

and beginning to look into incorporating it into battle labs being built for developing the Air Force's Advanced Battle Management System.

The 513th's active-duty partner wing, the 552d Air Control Group, is also participating in the upcoming military use assessment to determine how to integrate ACES into current and future airframes.

"We knew we had something special here, and we needed to increase our circle of influence," Mattey said. "We reached out to the 552nd, and found out they had just stood up an innovation cell. They brought AWACS requirements from active duty, making them a part of our SBIR effort. It's a TFI effort with the 513th, the 552nd, the New Hampshire Army National Guard, as well as industry and academia."







# **COVID-19** pandemic not over, concerns over delta variant growing

**WASHINGTON (AFNS)** -- Nearly 68% of active duty personnel have been vaccinated against COVID-19 with at least one dose. But that still leaves many service members vulnerable to the delta variant of the virus, health officials at the Pentagon said.

Due to the effectiveness of the Defense Department's ongoing vaccination program, COVID-19 case counts across the department are dropping and installation commanders have been reducing local health protection conditions, or HPCON levels, Dr. Terry Adirim, the acting assistant secretary of defense for health affairs, said during a press briefing at the Pentagon.

"However, the delta variant poses a threat to that return

to normal." Adirim said."We are particularly concerned with the impact of the delta variant on our unvaccinated or partially-vaccinated population, and its potential spread at installations that are located in parts of the country with low vaccination rates."

According to the military health system, the delta variant of the COVID-19 virus is

more transmittable, causes more severe disease, and results in higher cases of hospitalization and death than any other strain of the virus.

"The pandemic is not over, and we are not done with our all-out efforts to encourage vaccination," Adirim said.

The DOD has an active whole genome sequencing program in place to identify what strain of the virus is present in those who test positive for COVID-19, Adirim said.

"We're closely watching our DOD case counts, positivity rates and the prevalence of the delta variant among all the other variants of concern," she said. "We anticipate that health protection conditions could change at some of our installations in the future based on outbreaks that result from the high transmutability of the delta variant.

"The more virulent delta variant is spreading quickly through communities with lower vaccination rates," she said. "... and it is likely to become the predominant variant in the United States. The delta variant poses a threat to our service members who are not fully vaccinated. The best way to beat the delta variant is to be fully vaccinated."

Studies have shown that one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine is only about 33% effective against the delta variant, while two doses are at least 88% effective, Adirim said.

"We are investing great effort into ensuring our service members and other beneficiaries get both doses," she said. "So the bottom line is get vaccinated, they are safe and effective."



Across the entire DOD, including military personnel, family members, civilians and contractors, there have been 303,000 cases of COVID-19 and 355 deaths related to the disease.


"Right now, there are about 21 individuals hospitalized for COVID-19 in DOD facilities," said Army Lt. Gen. Ronald J. Place, Defense Health

Agency director.

"This is a decline from a peak of 240 inpatients on January 8 of this year, essentially the lowest point we've had since the earliest days of the pandemic," Place said.

"If those who have not yet been vaccinated need further proof of the vaccine's effectiveness," Place said, "it's the status of those currently hospitalized within the military's health system. Of the 21 COVID-positive individuals in DOD hospitals, none of them are vaccinated.

We thank our service members and DOD personnel who have been vaccinated and continue to strongly encourage our remaining service members, DOD retirees, all of their families, and DOD staff to get vaccinated — for themselves, for their families and for the community."
