SOONER GROUP FLYS TO DOMINICAN REPUBLIC, PUERTO RICO, AND TO FAR EAST COUNTRIES

The 937th Sooner Group has joined forces repeatedly recently with other "Ready-Now" Reservists of CONAC's C-124, C-119, and C-123 airlift forces.

The men of the 937th have flown three missions to Puerto Rico (2) and the Dominican Republic (1) for a total of 41,168 ton miles and 89,050 passenger miles.

Vietnam bound aircraft have been halted at Clark AFB, P.I. once and at Hickham AFB, Hawaii once for a total of 301,531 ton miles. Another flight to Saigon is in the air at the time the SOONER NEWS goes to press.

CONAC volunteer crews have made more than 125 flights into the Santo Domingo area and many other flights were made to transport men and equipment within the United States and to such far flung locations as Saigon, Iceland, Greenland, Alaska, Brazil and other areas.

COMMANDER'S COLUMN

To run a business properly it is necessary to inventory your stock periodically. Some businesses do this on a monthly basis and others do it on a yearly basis. This inventory points out what you are overstocked with. what you need to order, and gives the business man an idea of his net worth.

I think we should do the same thing in our reserve program because a review of our resources and our "stock" will point out areas we need to improve in during the coming months.

During the last six months we have shown a steady increase in airmen manning. We have gone from 479 airmen in November 1964 to 581 airmen to date. Our officer manning increased from 85 to 109, and our UTA attendance for May was 98% for officers and 97% for airmen.

The one area where our "stock" is low is in the SKT passing percentage. We must improve our on-the-job training. This calls

for emphasis by each commander, each supervisor, each OJT administrator and trainer and each OJT trainee. If we all pull to gether in this one area, we will exceed the standards and again verify the fact that the 937th is the outstanding group in the U. S.

We are also on the verge of improving our combat capability. By up-grading 5 navigators and 5 engineers we will attain a readiness status never obtained by any C-124 Reserve unit.

To sum up: All members of this group must concentrate on the following:

- Improve our OJT Program so that we improve our SKT passing rate.
- Recruit airmen and officers to attain 100% manning.
- 3. Up-grade sufficient crew members to receive our combat capability.
- Maintain the high level of attendance and management we have enjoyed during the past six months.

Our 937th Group is reaching for the top rung of the ladder. Let's all get together, work hard and make the next six months as interesting and rewarding as the last six months have been.

I know at inventory time next January all of these goals will have been reached.

GROUND SAFETY OFFICER SEZ
"BE ALERT WHEN MOWING LAWN"

The following list of suggested rules were prepared by the 937 Safety Office concerning safety precautions when mowing your lawn this summer.

- 1. Check and clear the lawn of foreign objects prior to mowing.
- 2. Clear the area of bystanders so that in the event the mower strikes and throws an object no one will be injured.
- 3. Don't mow the lawn barefooted or with flimsy footwear.
- 4. Before adjusting the mower shut the engine off and remove spark plug wire.
- 5. Don't fill the gas tank of a hot engine. Wait until it cools off.
- 6. If lawn has hills or banks, mow along face of incline rather than up and down.
- 7. Never leave the engine running when a mower is unattended.
- 8. BE ALERT !!!!


