## PREPARING FOR WINTER DRIVING HAZARDS?

In most parts of our country, winter driving is bringing its special set of rules for safety and survival. Winter is different; thus drivers will have to approach winter driving differently.

First of all, be sure that the automobile is in top shape because cold weather driving puts more and different kinds of stress and strain on it. Generally, the car owner's manual contains valuable information useful for cold weather operation. For example, drivers should assure that, among other things: The cooling system is properly checked and filled with anti-freeze. The electrical system receives adequate inspection and attention. A weak battery that made it through the summer usually will be inadequate in frigid winter weather. A check is made for leaks in muffler pipes, the muffler, and its connections. Tires provide adequate traction on ice, snow, or wet roads. (Some areas may require use of snow chains.)

Usually, winter driving takes considerable more time..engine warm-up, getting started and stopped, getting from home to work and home again. While the car is warming up, the window areas should be cleared free of frost, ice, or snow..including the outside mirror. Also, slower speeds should be maintained on slippery roads, as well as avoiding sudden stops, starts and turns. A sharp eye is needed to spot glare ice,

or other slick spots from behind the wheel. The brakes should be pumped to slow down or stop on slippery surfaces.

Blind corners and intersections often feature sliding vehicles that can't stop in time, stalled drivers, and accidents that happened previously. Keep a good distance behind the vehicle ahead..allowing enough room to stop instantly, if you have to.

Winter driving can be lots of fun, a new experience, or an exciting challenge. It can be a season of safe, uneventful driving.or it can be a series of problems. All personnel, whether they operate government or private vehicles, should adhere closely to local safe winter driving practices, including those provided in Chapter 9, AFM 127-101.
