The local unit achieved a numerical rating of 95 per cent for the Oct. 5-9 period. This is the highest rating yet attained by an of the reserve maintenance organizations.

Maj. Gen. Rollin B. Moore Jr., commander of AFRES, said the rating "reflects the high degree of competence with which the 937th, to a man, discharges its assigned respon-

He added, "The MSEP is very demanding. It requires understanding top-level management, professional performance, and insistence on strict compliance with all technical directives. All of these require the utmost in individual dedication and discipline. The 937th had these outstanding traits and more."

vice president for air; llt Charles Osborne, junior vice president for air; llt John Stephen Hope, information officer; and Capt. Karolyn Bruner, historian.


The state organization claims 1,300 members, representing all branches of the services.

Johnson served in the Army during World War II as a combat soldier. He fought with the Fifth Army in Italy and participated in the invasion of Southern France as a member of the Seventh Army.
