Reserve Officers Take Career Development

ARPC, DENVER, COLO. (AFRNS) -- Over 8,000 Reserve officers are included in the recently established Officer Career Development Program that is designed to assist Reserve officers in planning their military careers.

The program was established to assist officers in the grade of lieutenant colonel and below.

This includes officers assigned to an active pay status, excluding all professional officers (chaplain, legal, medical) Air Reserve Technicians and 10 U.S. Code 8033/265 officers and officers within one year of retirement.

Heart of the monitoring plan is AF Form 419, Reserve Officer Career Objective Statement.

One copy of the form is sent to the Air Reserve Personnel Center (ARPC) where career planners include it in the officer's individual case file.

The second copy is retained by the consolidated base personnel office (CBPO) in the field personnel record.

Information on the form 419 is used by career planners to plan and recommend future assignments, professional mili-

tary education and technical training for each Reserve officer.

TSgt Larry Skelly, Ext 7491, CBPO has been appointed Officer Career Development Program Manager to assist in answering questions and completion of the Form 419.

AF Women Get Two New Uniforms

AFNS - In a statement made recently by Colonel Bianca D. Trimeloni, Director of Women in the Air Force (WAF), Air Force women can look forward to two new uniforms--a dark blue pantsuit and a green fatigue specifically designed for women.

According to the colonel, "The pantsuit has been approved and is now available through commercial sources. It may be worn year round with the accessories prescribed for the service uniform.

The fatigue prototype needs to be presented to the Air Force Uniform Board for final approval."

Worn-Out 1505s Exchangable For Blues

If you are not legally "fat" or your military bearing is not "wearing", your chances of exchanging 1505s for blues on a one-to-one basis are getting tougher.

Reservists who wish to exchange AF1505 uniforms on a fair-wear-and-tear basis must take the worn uniforms to the detachment Logistics Office, says Capt. Jackie D. Ogden, logistics officer. The uniforms (maximum of three each) will be inspected for serviceability before exchange.

Reservists who wish to exchange 1505s for blues because they no longer fit, must have a letter from TAC Clinic stating a definite, documented weight gain or loss.

Both the Clinic's letter and the 1505s must be taken to the Logistics Office before a clothing-exchange letter will be initiated.


Exchanges should be made prior to the end of the September UTA; otherwise 1505s will be worn one more year.


